A Message From Tracey Graham, AVGC President.....

Summer is upon us, and the temperatures are rising! As members of the Apple Valley Gun Club, we're very fortunate to be able to shoot late into the evening on any of our well-lit ranges. This is a perfect time to bring the family out and take advantage of our cool desert evenings. (Just remember, all shooting must cease at 10:00 PM, unless you're using the indoor range for small-bore shooting.)

For those interested in becoming a Level 1 Rifle Coach, the Club will be hosting a 16-hour certification course on August 18th and 19th. Successful completion of this clinic leads to accreditation as a Small-bore Rifle/Air Rifle (Level 1) Coach or Junior Coach. Junior Coaches must be between the ages of 15-17. Letters of recommendation are required from the parent or Range Chair for each Junior Coach applicant. Clinic includes: Safety; How to Run a Match; Sports Psychology; Training Plans; Fundamentals; Rules; Hands-on Position; Coaching, Equipment and other subjects. The limit is twelve coaches. The Club will be funding these certifications; however, each applicant must agree to volunteer with our Jr. Rifle Program at least 10 times over the course of the year. Some of you may be aware that the NRA is rolling out their own CCW Course. In order for instructors to be trained to teach the course, Training Counselors first need to be certified to teach the Instructors. As an NRA Gold Medal Club, Apple Valley Gun Club has been selected as the Training Counselor Training Site for the Southwest. We'll be hosting this two-day training program on June 23rd and 24th, for TCs from all over the Western states. We believe this CCW Course will become the standard for issuance of CCW permits in San Bernardino County. By having NRA certified CCW Instructors, there's an excellent possibility that we will once again be able to assist the Sheriff's Office with their process and significantly increase revenue for the Club.

Please remember, this is YOUR Club, and your input and involvement are critical for the Club's continued success. We meet at Victor Valley Christian Church at the corner of 11th & Eucalyptus in Hesperia on the third Wednesday of each month at 7:00 PM. Please come join us.

UPDATE FROM ED SWAN – VICE PRESIDENT

During the month of June, the Club will be using the new Incident/Close Call Report forms available at each of the ranges with locking deposit boxes for the completed reports at the Adobe and Trap Club Houses. The purpose of the form is to report incidents that occur involving Personal Injury or Property Damage. When an Incident occurs, a form should be completed as soon as possible and dropped in to one of the locked deposit boxes.

The Club is also interested in knowing about Close Calls. These are situations that involve a potential of injury or property damage. The Club wants to keep track of Close Calls because if a situation keeps occurring, we can correct it before it reaches the "Incident" level. Please be sure to complete the form should you ever be involved in and "Incident" or "Close Call".

SPONSORING A MEMBER AT THE APPLE VALLEY GUN CLUB

In lieu of background checks, the AVGC relies on input from each sponsor regarding the new probationary member's suitability.

Sponsors should meet with their probationary member at least 3 times during the 90 day period. This would include time shooting at the range and attending the new member orientation meeting.

If a sponsor should notice any areas of concern, he should relay the information to a member of the AVGC Board *prior* to the expiration of the probationary period. This would include non-responsiveness by the probationary member. If no concerns are reported, the probationary period will continue as outlined in the Club's Policies and Procedures.
