Presentation of Colors and Pledge of Allegiance

Review August 2019 GM Minutes. Motion to accept the minutes by Dina. Jonathan second. All BOD in favor. Motion passes to accept the minutes as written.

Reports

Treasurer- Jonathan Weldy

1. Report on account balances to include Business Checking, Capital Account, Money Market Account, and Scholarship Account. Jonathan reported that Sheri Oros is engaged as bookkeeper and all accounts have been moved to the cloud. Jonathan is still printing checks. Additionally, the Money Market account was about to be declared dormant. Jonathan transferred money out and back in for housekeeping to keep account open. Jonathan also announced that on 9/18 we are hosting Sonic Ear protection and to see Jonathan if you want to sign up for an appointment. Corey LaFever, with Sonic Ear Protection was in attendance and presented his product to the membership.

Secretary- Elizabeth Stuppy

1. Membership numbers stand at 1,258, with 639 regular members, 132 associate members, and 487 senior members.
2. Newsletter: It will be going out 10/1. Elizabeth will email blast it to the membership and paper copies will be at the adobe by the sign-in book. If you have any club announcements let Elizabeth know by 9/22.

Vice President-Diana Roederer

1. Report on Education and Training- classes are going well and filling up. Basic Rifle is this Saturday and it has a few seats left. Basic Pistol is on 9/21 and there are a few seats left.
2. NRA has a new powerpoint for Refuse to Be a Victim, which comes with a new manual. The cost is \$25. We have 12 RBV Instructors. Diana

proposed the club pay for the new manuals. It would be approximately \$300, plus shipping. Discussion held. This is an additional cost above our training materials budget. Elizabeth made a motion for the club to pay for 11 of the update manuals. Second by Ken. All in favor. Motion passes to purchase 11 manuals.

3. High Desert Youth Soccer League opening day moved from 9/7 to 9/21. Request for volunteers went out to the membership

President- Ed Swan

1. Regularly scheduled election announcement in accordance with the Bylaws. Nominations will open at the next membership meeting. Ed went over the offices up for nomination.
2. Advised GM that BOD has approved remote range monitoring program. Ed explained in detail the items that were discussed at the BOD meeting. Ed called for discussion. No one from the membership posed any questions or comments for the second month in a row.
3. Scholarship Award presented to Emma Harbottle (not present due to school). Accepting on her behalf = dad Steve.

Range Reports

- Pistol Range- Tracey Graham: Range is doing well. Tractor work is starting next week for the berms. (Tim corrected to October) Also in October is the DA plate rack challenge. If you want to shoot against law enforcement shooters, sign up for it. Come out and practice on Sunday. There are lots of matches at the pistol range, look at the calendar for dates and times to participate.
- Indoor Range - Kyle Butts: Briefed the membership on the indoor range. Advised you need to do an orientation and to get with him or CJ.
-Junior Pistol-CJ Caruth: Going well. We lost some coaches so he requested coaches and RSOs to help. Additionally, the cooler is working. Reminder .22 rimfire only.
-Junior Rifle-Ray Jameson: no report. Ray left after the BOD meeting
-SASP-Tim Neubauer: Advised the membership that there was an opening event 1 month ago that went well. The program will be starting the first Saturday in October from 6pm-8pm. He needs coaches, volunteers, and RSOs. There is an application to help with this program as well as a fee. All volunteers must go through 2 background checks (Club pays for 1, the other is for SASP). He intends to do a rotating schedule so it's not the same people volunteering every single time. Ed requested Tim give background on SASP to the membership. Tim explained the program is action shooting at steel targets during timed events. It will be competition in virtual matches to start with, and

travelling eventually. The program is starting at high school age through full time college students. He tested targets earlier in the day and they worked great.

- Rifle Range- Jason Myskow: Everything is going great on the range. He got all the new steel up and it is still doing well. Someone shot a 50 cal at the deflector and put a hole in it, but other than that all is well.
-CMP-Alex Montenegro: no report
- Trap Range- Gary Menser: You never have to shoot in the sun again because BOD just approved canopies! Also, he got 24 pallets of clays so both containers are full and the range should be good for 6 months. He reminded everyone that the range chairs have their phone numbers posted at each range. Gary went over the calendar for trap shooting. He advised that the range requires a separate orientation. Finally, next Monday, the time is going to be 9 am instead of 8 am.
-CRSO report: Gary advised he is the club CRSO.
- Archery Range- Sandy Oberlies: more people are coming in to the archery range lately. Sandy went over the calendar and pricing. She advised that they had the first week of a Vegas style tournament that shoots on Thursday nights for \$5. The competition runs for 9 weeks. Winner is best of 7 out of the 9 weeks.
- Facilities - Tim Smith: This Sunday is the work party so new members can get their volunteer hours and their orientation done in one day.
-Proposal for the club to pay for bottled water at all the ranges: He bought 84 cases of water to see how long that lasts. Tim made a motion for the club to pay for bottled water at each of the ranges. TJ seconded the motion. Open to the membership for discussion. It was mentioned that the recycling generated is money that can be used for whatever the club needs. Tim advised that a pallet of water is ~ \$400, which is why he is doing a pilot program to see how long it lasts. Jonathan suggested waiting to see how long the pallet lasts and coming back. Deb S. asked if the water could be used for ANYTHING, like the various programs, or just for the membership. Further discussion held. Decision was made to bring it back to the membership if it does not work out. Opened the motion to the membership for a vote. Most in favor. 3 members opposed. Motion carries to have the club pay for water and bring it back to the membership if it does not work out.
-October Work Party: request to make it 8am-5pm for some tractor work on the trap range and extended work on the rifle range. Motion made

by Gary. Second by Mike. Discussion held. Opened for vote. All in favor. None opposed. Motion passes.

- Merchandise- Sandy Oberlies: New members get a free hat. She does have a few order forms for anyone wanting jackets.
