Diana Welcome message:

-reminded members to sign in and visit the flyer table for information on classes and matches. She also advised that we have a merchandise table set up as well
-Thank you to the membership for patience and understanding while we were forced to cancel all events open to the public. The good news is that we stayed open for members and we are back up and running! There is a huge need for training in the community as there have been many gun sales during COVID. Please encourage people to come take a class and get training. Thanks to the members for all the support. Big thank you to the Board and to the Range Chairs and Facilities for continuing business during this time. A lot of work was happening on the range. Diana asked Tim to stand up and be acknowledged. HUGE thank you, Tim! Tim also acknowledged Dennis Ingram for his help. HUGE thank you, Dennis! We are having the meeting on the range because it would have been a hardship for the church with just the disinfecting alone. Diana introduced the Board again since the last official meeting with the membership was just after the elections.

Reports

Treasurer- Jonathan Weldy

1. Report on account balances to include Business Checking, Capital Account, Money Market Account, and Scholarship Account
2. Out of the totals we have, there is about \$20-30k of additional commitments for the Capital Improvements and other odds and ends.

Vice President-Tracey Graham

1. Train-A-Teacher Day moved to 8/1. Last year we had a lot of educators come out. It takes a lot of members to put this on. We will have a meeting later this month to outline areas of responsibility. Tracey went over the classes that will be had that day. If you know anyone in education, let them know. It will be on Eventbrite in about 3 weeks.
2. Safety concerns-Everyone doing really well. Keep it up. If you see someone doing something not great, address it politely. Don't get complacent. Remember the rules.

President-Diana Roederer

1. Advise membership of success of Probationary Recovery Plan- HUGE thank you to Tina. Diana explained how the day went and it's because Tina made it happen along with the RST Directors, volunteers RSOs, and instructors. Just about all members on probation came off probation.
2. Advise membership that we did not send the \$1k to the CRPA that was previously approved to combat AB3071 since it was pulled for the year. Diana will likely ask again when it comes back around.
3. The Galley provided dinner tonight. The BOD can only approve \$1,000.00 and it went over a bit. Diana is asking the membership for an additional \$500 to cover whatever we went over on the bill. Motion for \$500 by TJ. Second by Clay. All in favor. Motion passes.
4. Danny and Hannah Schaff scholarship presentation. Diana introduced the kids and their many accomplishments. They were presented with Certificates and checks. Tracey advised the membership that half of the raffle ticket money goes to the scholarship fund and encouraged eligible members to put in an application.
5. George Ellison, the Archery Range Chair has asked to step down and provide support only. Sandy Oberlies is willing to take over. Diana made a motion to accept Sandy as the new range chair. Dina seconded. All in favor. Motion passes. Thank you, Sandy! Diana asked Lawrence to stand up and he was introduced as the Archery Range right hand man. Diana advised that Lawrence has put together a new extended archery program. The flyers are on the table.

Range Reports

- Pistol Range- Ed Swan: Ed went over the standard matches that occur regularly on the calendar. Please always check the calendar before you come out to the range to shoot. Ed thanked Tim, Dennis, and Jonathan for the sidewalk and restrooms. Ed quipped that the credit goes to

himself since the improvements were made while he was the range chair. ☺

-SASP-Tim Neubauer: (Excused Absence) Ed advised briefly on the program during his pistol range report. Cheyenne was asked to come up and give a report. She congratulated the SASP team and encouraged members to come out. She mentioned that the team is picking out shirts/outfits, etc. for their traveling competitions. Being part of the team means you help out! Shout out Matt for bringing out the fun stuff to shoot!

- Indoor Range - CJ Caruth: CJ explained trajectory change when you sit and shoot versus standing. Make sure you hit the bullet trap and don't shoot the pulleys! If you see red, don't shoot! Know your target and what's beyond. There is an orientation to get the code to the indoor range. Call CJ for an appointment.
-Junior Pistol-CJ Caruth: The junior programs are still shut down. We just can't do the social distancing with the kids and be safe. He has been in contact with the parents and they are on board.
-Junior Rifle-Ray Jameson: Echoed CJ. For safety, Jr. Rifle is shut down right now. He can still do orientation, contact him if you are interested.
- Rifle Range-Jason Myskow: Everything going good. There is a new target at the 380 range to the right of the 300 target. It's red. The rocks below are painted yellow and red. They did have a rattle snake on the range. Please don't mess with them when you see them. Call Jason to deal with it. Also, don't put clay targets out there on the ground and shoot them. If you want to shoot shotgun go to the trap range. Jason went over the calendar and matches. Diana advised that if you find something that is broken please call the range chair and let them know. Don't leave it for someone else to find.
-CMP-Alex Montenegro : Alex explained CMP for the new people and gave the calendar information. Also, on 6/20 in the indoor range there will be a CMP .22 rifle sporter match. On July 4th there will be a BBQ and a CMP match that morning. Alex explained how the 4th of July match will be run. Alex went over the plans for the BBQ. Everyone in the club is invited! There will also be a swap meet that same day. Contact Alex for details and information. Try to make it firearms related if you plan to sell at the swap meet. Alex went over surplus gun sales-you need to have participated in a CMP program.
- Trap Range- Gary Menser: Nothing really changed for the past couple of months. Everyone took about a week off and then the members came back to the range to shoot. Gary explained open Trap and also pricing. Reminder that the first point of contact for the range is the range chair. Therefore, contact Woody first as he is the Trap Range Chair. Gary went

over the Jr program and that they are a traveling 5-star program competition team.

-CRSO report: Reminder that all the delinquent RSOs need to update their credentials and also first aid/cpr! Learn CPR For Life is a great class.

- Archery Range-Sandy Oberlies (absent): Lawrence reported. He created an Extended Archery program. He gave the dates for the program and advised that it is for adults only. Open archery has not opened yet. Thank you to Tim Smith for the connex on the archery range that is keeping our equipment safe.
- Facilities - Tim Smith: A while ago he got the membership to approve buying water and providing it free to the members. Since then he constantly finds half-drunk bottles just laying around. If that continues, we will no longer provide free water. Since we were closed for two months, he will choose a sign-in winner for each, April and May. Winners are Brent Philipini and Joshua Carson. Reminder to the members that when you sign in correctly, you have the opportunity to win a t-shirt or hat. The 21st is the work party, which is also Father's Day. Tim will still be here. Anyone that wants to come to the work party can come out.

Other Reports

- Merchandise-Ray Jameson: Ray went over the merchandise table and explained the challenge coin. Get with Ray if you have any suggestions for merchandise.
- Education and Training-Tim Neubauer (excused absence): reported by Diana Roederer. Classes are all back up and running. Things are already full! There are discounted prices for June and July. Explanation given on the Range Safety Class and how it differs from Range Specific Training. The Range Safety Class is free to the members and you need to sign up with Diana.

Special Report

- David Smith with a Legislative Update: Dave gave a very detailed and informative report.

OLD BUSINESS -

1. Tim Smith-Progress of Capital Range Improvements: The restrooms will be completed by the end of next week. He will put the push button locks on tomorrow and also the railing will be put up tomorrow. The next project is the upper trap range and putting in DG. Alex opined that there are some pretty

good-sized weeds around the range and maybe we can think about spraying? Tim wants to find a weed spray that doesn't cause cancer for liability reasons. Another member suggested a way to indicate when the restrooms are occupied. Tim said he is installing vacant/in use dead bolts.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Diana spoke about our club running on volunteers. She asked Danielle Clark (13 years old) to come up and Danielle was introduced to the membership. Diana explained everything that Danielle helps with at the range.
2. Tracey Graham-Re-cap of safety for the previous month (good and bad): Reminder to the members, speaking of the weeds, you should not be using steel core ammo. You can get a strike and start a fire. To add on to what David reported, if you are not aware of what is going on in Sacramento, you aren't doing your part. We have two great organizations you can support, the CRPA and SBCGOA. We need to get local leaders elected that are pro 2A. Diana told the members to take the time to write the letters, make the phone calls, and send the emails.
3. Diana for Tim N.: Reminder to the membership that event requests should go through the Range Chair as a courtesy. Please submit requests 12 prior to the Board meeting for adequate consideration.
4. Diana: Proposal for funds in the amount of \$1,500 in support of the San Bernardino County Sheriff's Rodeo. Diana made the motion. Kyle seconded. Discussion held. Motion to amend the proposal to \$2,000 by Ron. Joe Second. Further discussion was held. All in favor. Motion for funds for \$2,000 to support the Sheriff's Rodeo passes.
5. Introduction of new members. Diana called up the new members. Motion by TJ to accept the members as probationary. Second by Gary. All in favor. Motion passes. Tracey went over the probationary requirements.
6. 50/50 raffle with half the proceeds going to the Scholarship Fund- winner Richard!!
7. Diana announcement: Everyone please pickup your trash before you go!
