Safety is always our number one priority at the Apple Valley Gun Club. Remember to uncase and case your firearms ONLY at the bench. Never behind the bench. Never lay a loaded firearm down on the bench at any time. All firearms on the bench MUST have the action open, port side up, magwell empty. This makes it easy for you, your guests and others walking by to verify that firearms resting on the benches are unloaded. If you need to set a firearm down on the bench simply remove the magazine, lock the slide to the rear, make sure the muzzle is pointed down range, port side up. Never touch a firearm laying on the bench, sitting in a case or holstered, when someone is anywhere in front of the bench.

The Three "B"s"

How do you know what ammunition is safe for your gun?

Always check the Three "B's": the barrel, the box and the base.

Every modern firearm has the caliber stamped into the **barrel** or on the slide. Match that with what is printed on the **box** of ammo that you are using. Then verify by checking the headstamp, or the **base** of the cartridge. All three should match.

Additionally, you should read your manufacture's owner's manual to determine if your gun is rated for +P or +P+ ammo AND always keep your ammo in the original box.

The casings shown below all came from our range, over a period of less than a month. One was a brand-new shooter who was using the ammo that the local gun store had sold her with her new gun. That can be put down to not knowing any better. The other two came from experienced shooters. Those can only be attributed to negligence and complacency. While these three instances clearly demonstrate the potential for disaster, these shooters were fortunate and only had to suffer a little humiliation. Shooting is inherently an extremely dangerous sport, but that potential danger is magnified exponentially when we get complacent. -Tracey Graham



WE HAVE A NEW SCHOLARSHIP PROCESS!

Our newest Director, Bill Stephens, spent many hours revising our scholarship process. The final version was presented to the membership and approved. This new process will help the club choose the most deserving candidates and make sure the Club Scholarship funds are well spent. Thank you, Bill, for all your hard work.



Summary of Requirements:

- Applicant must be a college-bound member and/or associate member under the age of 24 who has demonstrated personal characteristics and habits consistent with the statements contained in our Bylaws, Article II, Section 1, Paragraphs (b) (1) and (2).
- The applicant must complete and submit the Apple Valley Gun Club Scholarship Application (See Website or Appendix of the Policies & Procedures for Application).
- $\overline{\delta}$ Applications will be accepted between December 1st and March 1st for review.
- Funds shall be distributed to the successful candidates upon submission of proof of enrollment in a four-year college, university, community college, or trade school.
- Scholarship awards will be presented to the successful candidates during regular General Membership meetings between the months of June to September. If the student is away at school and unable to attend an Apple Valley Gun Club General Membership meeting, other arrangements, such as mail, can be made.
- Scholarships and grants shall have a maximum limit of \$3,000 per recipient for scholarships and four allocations for grants.
