

Beyond Basics Firearms Training Course

Taking Basics One Step Further

Beyond Basics is available to students who have completed the NRA Basic Pistol (BOPS) class. Beyond Basics offers new shooters/students a chance to practice shooting some of what they just learned from the NRA Basic Pistol (BOPS) class. It's a great opportunity to re-enforce the skills they just learned.

One-Handed, Off-Hand and Magazine Changes Included in Beyond Basics

The NRA Basic Pistol class covers a lot of information about owning and shooting your handgun and includes a shooting qualification at the end. It's a great beginning class. Students however were wanting more shooting time. So, we created a course to take the basics and expand on them. Shooting one handed, off-hand, adding speed and doing magazine changes are just a sample of what the course offers. The course is done from the bench and in the standing position. There is no holster work in this course.

One-on-One Training with an NRA Instructor

After successfully passing the NRA Basic Pistol class, the student can sign up for the 3-hour course that fine tunes the basics they just learned. Each student will have an NRA coach by their side – one-on-one where the coach can help the student gain more confidence while shooting. There is some training in this course; however, it's mostly honing your skills while having a lot of fun.

With safety foremost, the course is geared to give the student more shooting time. It also lets them see how additional training is possible with other NRA classes and AVGC matches.

If you are a new graduate of the BOPS from AVGC, or you have passed this course from AVGC in the past year, you can easily sign up for this course. Look for the dates on Eventbrite or the calendar on the AVGC website at AppleValleyGunClub.com.

The new Beyond Basics course will be offered about every two months and costs \$50 with a coupon of \$10 off for passing the BOPS class. The coupon and course are good for up to a year after passing the BOPS. We want you to have the best experience and build on your "basics".

Jonathan brought an idea to the Safety Committee to hash out a few details and a new opportunity was born!

Director, Larry Mason, jumped on the project, even before being elected to the Board of Directors, because he saw a stellar marketing opportunity. Larry created a beautiful certificate to give to the first-time handgun owner and proceeded to visit our local partners. He visited Express Gun Locker, Turner's Outdoorsman, and US Patriot Armory. All shops were excited to assist AVGC in this endeavor!

We are inviting the first-time handgun owner to a two-hour range opportunity with their new firearm. The two hours start with a brief classroom introduction to safety and initial skills, followed by live fire on our range. Each new shooter will have a personal NRA-certified instructor to ensure the experience is safe, comfortable, and educational. After the live fire, there will be a debriefing session for feedback, questions, and additional information.

AVGC is the premier firearms training facility in the High Desert, and we look forward to bringing this first step to the first-time handgun owner. Help us spread the word!

A Little Club History...

By 1959, membership fees for the club were due by January 1st of each year and were delinquent by February 15th. The initiation fee for new members was \$100 and the annual membership dues were \$16 per year. This included a \$4.00 membership in the National Rifle Association. Officers and Directors were elected yearly.

The Articles of Incorporation, changing the name of the club to the Apple Valley Gun Club, was completed in December 1968. At that time, the initiation fee was still \$100 and the annual dues had increased to \$18.50 per year which included the \$6.50 fee for NRA membership. Dues were delinquent by February 25th. Officers and Directors were elected yearly. 13 members voted "aye" to change the name of the club, while 2 members voted "nay."

Sometime in 1983, the Bylaws were rewritten, eliminating the "male citizen" requirement and the first woman joined the club in the latter part of 1983 or early 1984. Her name was "Jerri", and her last name has been lost to time.

Rumors of the Past...

There were land barons, such as Newton Bass, who thought they could surround the club by buying up the hillside, there were easement battles, and fights with the City of Victorville, there were legal battles, and lack of money in the treasury. Still, the club members kept the club alive through donations and bonds.

There are rumors of poker parties until the wee hours, moving donated buildings in the middle of the night to outwit the law, Roy Rogers and his gang drinking in the clubhouse and then going shooting. It is said that the club rented property north of Victorville for pheasant and bird hunting. When a turkey shoot was held, they refused to buy anything but Apple Valley turkeys, raised locally.
