AVGC Youth Program Using the NRA Marksmanship Qualification Program

In 2024 the Board of Directors approved using the NRA Marksmanship Qualification Program (MQP) as part of the AVGC youth programs. During the third and fourth quarters of calendar year 2024 this was implemented in the Junior Rifle program, with the Junior Pistol Program starting in 2025. The program has been well received by participants and their parents.

Through February a total of eighteen youth participants have earned the first award, which is Pro-Marksman. Five have gone on to earn the Marksman award, and three of those have earned the Sharpshooter award and are actively working on Expert. The MQP is an NRA program open to anyone, not just youth. Our youth participants meet the same criteria as adults who participate in the MQP.

The objectives of using MQP are to encourage attendance and participation in our youth programs. The MQP program is structured such that the initial level, Pro-Marksman, is a fairly easy challenge. Each level thereafter has an increasing level of challenge, thereby encouraging the participants to work on improving their shooting skills.

Beverly Kulju would like to introduce you to Quilts of Valor



QOV MISSION <u>To cover Service Members and Veterans touched by war</u> with comforting and healing Quilts of Valor. Quilts of Valor (QOV) Foundation began in 2003 with a dream. Founder Catherine Roberts's son Nat was deployed to Iraq. According to Catherine "the dream was as vivid as real life. I saw a young man sitting on the side of his bed in the middle of the night, hunched over. The permeating feeling was one of utter despair. I could see his war demons clustered around, dragging him down an emotional gutter. Then, as if viewing a movie, I saw him in the next scene wrapped in a quilt. His whole demeanor changed from one of despair to one of hope and well-being." The quilt had made this dramatic change. The message of my dream was: **Quilts=Healing**. The model appeared simple: a volunteer team would donate their time and materials to make quilts. One person would piece the top, and another would quilt it.

To date, over 400,000 QOVs have been awarded to active duty or honorably discharged veterans. There are 78 State and District Coordinators and 1242 QOV Chapters across the United States that create and award quilts to those who are recommended for or request a quilt.

A QoV is a quality handmade quilt that is machine or hand-quilted. It is awarded to a Service Member or Veteran who has been touched by war. The quilt says unequivocally "Thank you for your service and sacrifice in serving our nation".

The Upland Chapter is very active and has quilts available to be awarded to a Service Member or Living Veteran we just need nominations. Please nominate a Veteran or Active Duty person.
